Our newest campus, opened in 2017, has a number of facilities including:

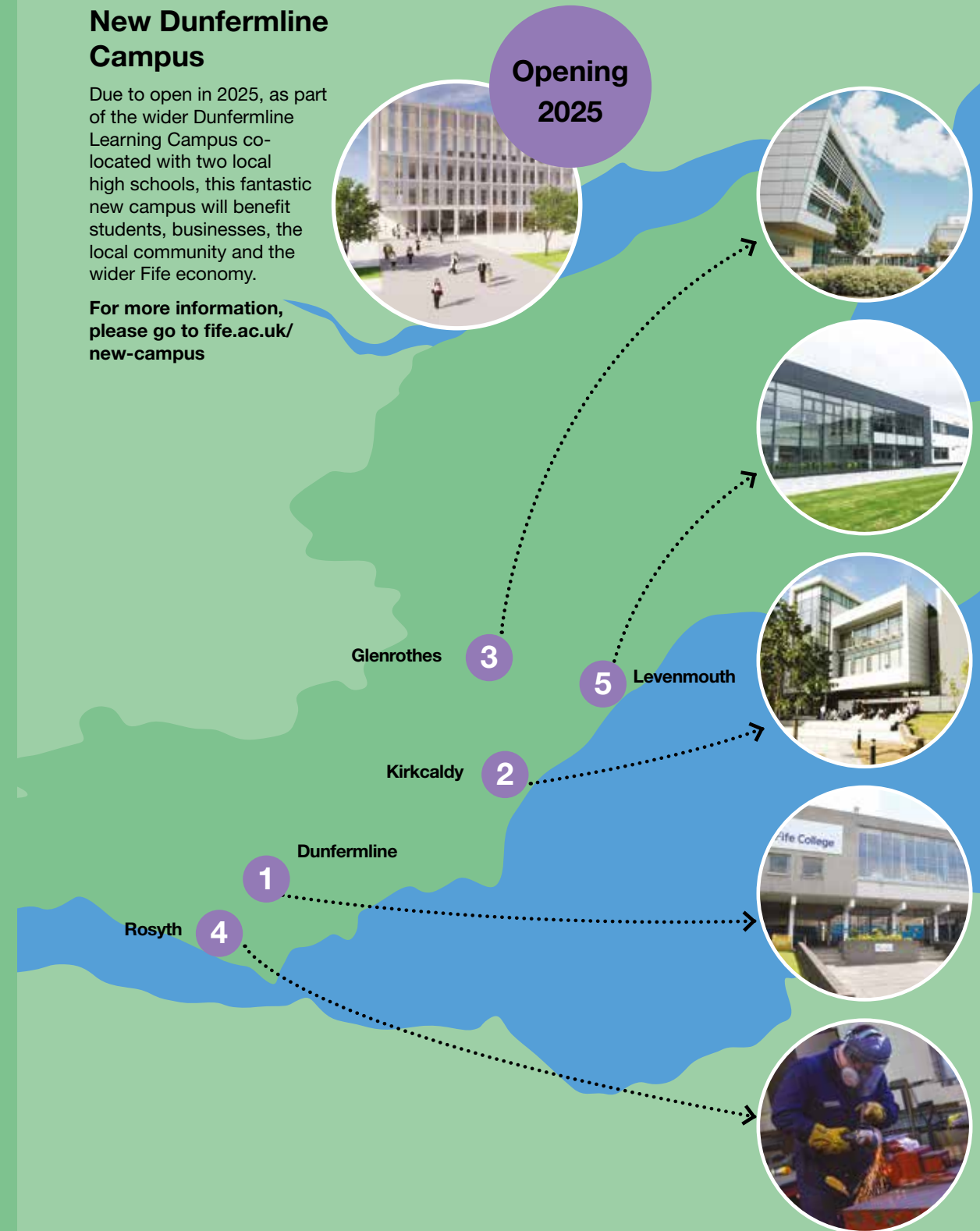
- Care facilities, to train our next generation of “front-line heroes”

YOUR STUDY OPTIONS

We have a wide range of study options at Fife College, giving you the flexibility and choice to fit your studies around work and life commitments.

We have courses to fit all ages and we cater for a variety of life stages – take a look at the options available (below) and see which one works best for you.

School College Partnership (SCP)

You don't have to wait until you finish school to start thinking about what you want to do afterwards – you can get a head start on your future by studying one of our fantastic School College Partnership courses as part of your school timetable.

These courses are designed to help you develop the skills you'll need both for further study and for employment, and will help you become an independent, self-motivated, and creative critical thinker.

You could even get ahead of the game on your degree studies, by completing the 1st year of a degree while you are still at school!

In many cases, signing up for an SCP course means you can study on a college campus where you'll experience college life, learn new skills in our state-of-the-art facilities, and study in vocational areas – like hospitality, digital, care, engineering, construction, and loads more.

All our courses are developed in line with universities and industry to ensure that you get the skills you really need for your future career.

Foundation Apprenticeships (FAs)

If you're a Fife school pupil in S5 or above, you can kick-start your career path with a Foundation Apprenticeship (FA).

This innovative pathway provides a winning combination of real-life work experience and learning the skills that employers want. You'll gain an industry-recognised qualification at SCQF Level 4, 5 or 6.

An FA at SCQF Level 6 is also a recognised entry requirement for a Modern Apprenticeship or degree-level study, so it can help you progress on to a career or further study.

We have 14 Foundation Apprenticeships available in partnership with Fife Council and Skills Development Scotland (SDS), so you can choose from a range of practical courses, providing a pathway to careers in sectors such as creative and digital media, food and drink technologies, engineering, accountancy and business skills.

Full-time study

Studying full-time is usually the quickest way for you to complete your qualification. It generally means you will attend college for 3-4 days a week, although this varies from course to course.

All our courses are designed to give you the best possible start to your chosen career – often including practical experience in your field.

Part-time study

Not everyone is able to commit to full-time study. If you've got a busy life, with family and work commitments, it's not always easy to find the time.

That's why we offer a range of part-time courses that better fits around your lifestyle and helps you learn something new and get the skills you need for the job you want.

You can choose to study a range of courses, from introductory level to HNC/HNDs and degrees, on a part-time basis to fit your studies around your other commitments. Whether day, evening, weekend, distance learning, online, or work-based learning suits you best, we are here to help you find the right option for you. Some courses are even available to apply for at any time of the year, so you can take that first step to your new career whenever you feel ready.

And with plenty of funding options available to you to support you with any costs, you will find that getting the qualification you need is within your reach!

Scottish Wider Access Programmes (SWAP)

SWAP courses are for adults who have few or no formal qualifications and who have been out of full-time education for at least three years.

SWAP courses are designed to give adult learners intensive academic preparation as well as the opportunity to develop the skills and confidence required to study at Higher Education level.

All of our SWAP courses are studied full-time for one year and are designed to prepare you for entry into HNC/HND or degree study through recognised progression routes at Fife College, and at other colleges and universities across Scotland.

DEGREE PATHWAYS

The flexible alternative to university, offering you the stepping stones to a degree

The higher education landscape has changed rapidly in recent years, with more and more students choosing to come to college to study for their higher education qualifications, including degrees.

At Fife College, we offer around 100 HNC and HND courses, with over 550 progression routes to degree courses both here at your local campus and at partner colleges and universities. The benefits of taking the college route to a degree include:

- ➔ No need to commit to 3-4 years of study at university – take each year at a time
- ➔ Gain a recognised qualification for every year of study
- ➔ Study closer to home, keeping living, travel and study costs to a minimum
- ➔ Enjoy smaller, more focused class sizes than at university
- ➔ It's local, flexible, affordable...and enjoyable!



DEGREE PATHWAYS

Higher National Qualifications – HNCs/HNDs

HNCs and HNDs are the equivalent level to years 1 and 2 at university, respectively. But they mean you get to study in a more flexible way that suits you and your plans for the future.

One of the many great things about studying at Fife College is that you don't have to commit to three or four years of continuous study like you would at university. You can just take it year by year, and see how you get on.

Because you finish each year with an industry recognised qualification, you have a qualification that could take you straight into a job. Or you could go on to study for your ordinary degree or honours degree, with us or via one of our partner universities. Plus you have the flexibility to take a break and consider what to do next.

If you choose to study for your HNC and HND at Fife College and then progress onto a degree programme starting in year 2 or 3, you will still achieve the same degree or honours degree qualification as your friends who went straight to university to study from year 1.

But here at Fife College, you'll be able to study in a smaller class, allowing you to get more help and support from your lecturers. Because you'll be studying locally, you can keep your living, travel, and study costs down.

Plus, you may be able to study on a part-time basis, at evenings or weekends, if that's what fits in best with your life.

Going on to university

If you want to carry on with your studies, Fife College is the perfect stepping stone to university.

Where there is an articulation route in place, you can move from an HNC or HND to year 2 or 3 of a degree without having to re-learn the same things or repeat a year of study.

While you are at college you will get information from our partner universities, at events or through visiting speakers, to help you make an informed choice about the right course to move on to.

And you'll get the chance to develop all the independent study and research skills you'll need to thrive when you go to university.

Qualifications Explained

All you need to know about the different levels of qualifications on offer.

Like all Scottish universities and colleges, we use the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) levels to describe our courses.

It shows how you can build up a series of points (known as “credit points”) to gain the qualification you want, transfer these credits onto other courses, and compare levels across different courses and qualifications.

Remember - there’s no one set or right way to progress through school, college, university and into the job you want. And one of the benefits of college is how flexible your route can be, with so many options available to suit your own circumstances. You can even take time out of your studies and pick them up again at a later stage.

Further Education (FE) qualifications

Certificate courses

Broadly comparable to SCQF Level 4 – the equivalent level to National 4s

Certificate courses are the perfect stepping stone for those with no or few formal qualifications. They are a cluster of units, mainly at SCQF Level 4, that will give you an appropriate set of skills and knowledge to progress on to the next SCQF level.

Intermediate Certificate courses

Broadly comparable to SCQF Level 5 – the equivalent level to National 5s

Intermediate Certificate courses contain a cluster of units, mainly at SCQF Level 5, that will give you an appropriate set of skills and knowledge to progress to the next SCQF level.

Advanced Certificate courses

Broadly comparable to SCQF Level 6 – the equivalent level to Highers

Advanced Certificate courses are a cluster of units, mainly at SCQF Level 6, that will give you an appropriate set of skills and knowledge to progress to the next SCQF level in your education or chosen career path.

These courses are made up of a cluster of units and successful achievement of these will provide you with all the knowledge you need to progress to a higher level of course in your chosen subject area, or into your chosen career path. Many of these units are accredited by an awarding body and the course may even include a small group award (eg – a National Progression Award) but they do not result in a large formal award like a National Certificate.

National Certificate courses

These courses hold a nationally recognised group award qualification at SCQF Levels 4, 5 or 6 and can be used as a stepping stone to employment or on to further study at a higher SCQF level.

Higher Education (HE) qualifications

Higher National Certificates (HNC)

SCQF Level 7 – the equivalent to year 1 at university.

HNCs are normally completed in one year full-time or in two years with part-time study. Upon successful completion of an HNC, you have options which may include progressing to an HND at Fife College, to a degree with one of our partner universities (often entering the degree course in year 2), or into employment.

Higher National Diplomas (HND)

SCQF Level 8 – the equivalent to year 2 at university.

An HND is two years of study if done as a full-time course. If you're progressing from HNC, you will go straight into the second and final year of the HND. They give you the option of progressing through to a degree (often entering year 3 of the degree course) or into employment.

Degrees

SCQF Levels 9 (Degree) and 10 (Honours Degree).


As well as routes to a wide range of degree courses at other institutions, with the benefit of studying the first one or two years locally, by working alongside our partner universities, we offer a great range of degrees right on your doorstep at Fife College campuses, so that you can study your whole degree with us in Fife. These degrees are awarded by our university partners so are the same as those issued to their own students.

Note: An Honours degree in Scotland takes 4 years of full-time study to complete, but in the English system an Honours degree takes 3 years.

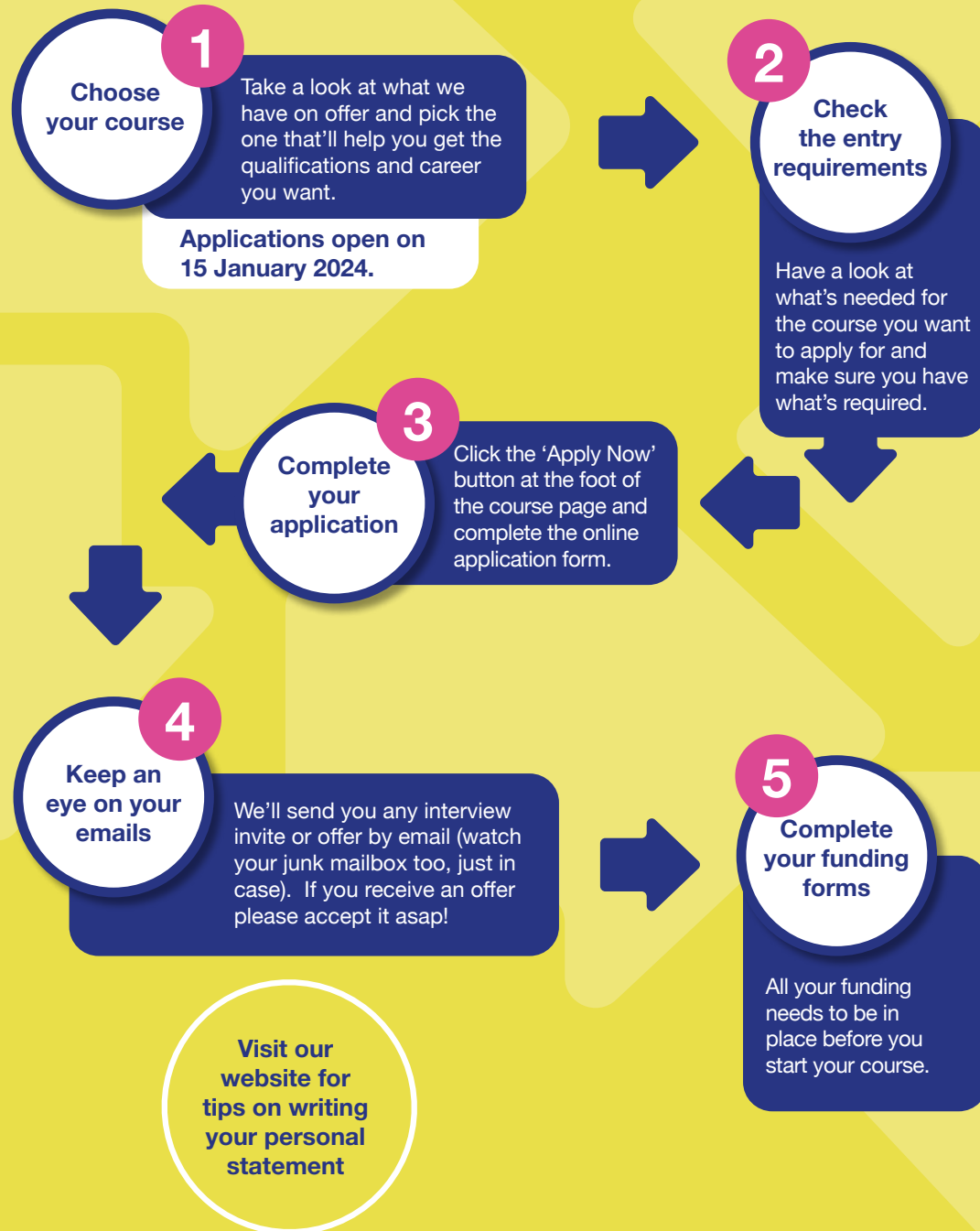

How to apply

Your step-by-step guide to applying for a course at Fife College.



Hints and tips

We make it quick and easy to apply for the course you want. To help make sure you get on your course, here's a few dos and don'ts to remember.

DO be ready to get your application in. Once applications are open on 15 January 2024, the sooner you apply the better your chance of getting on the course you want.

DO think about the course you want to do the most. You can apply for more than one course, but you can only accept one offer. And only one application will be progressed at any one time. So to give you the best chance of getting on the course you really want, have a think about which one is best suited to you and your plans for the future.

DO keep checking your emails. When you apply online, we'll keep in touch with you by email. But remember to check your junk email folder just in case our email has ended up there.

DON'T wait for all your exam results. Conditional offers for places can be given subject to you passing your exams, so you can apply before you get your results.

DON'T feel you need to do it all in one go. Once you've set up your login details, you can return to your application form at a later date from the Applications tab on the top bar of our website, so you don't have to do it all in one sitting. Just remember your username and password!

DON'T panic about interviews. This is also your chance to speak to course staff face-to-face and ask any questions you have.
